#### Feed Efficiency Matters:

Mostly straightbred Hereford steers fed in the 2024 American Hereford Association (AHA) Hereford Feedout Program at HRC Feed Yards in Scott City, KS, were compared to the 2023 program pen of similar cattle. Though fed 41 days longer than the 2023 pen, there was only a .09 increase in F:G (5.50 to 5.59), which was also impressively better than the Central Plains average of 6.35. When all factors were averaged from year to year, the 2024 steers generated \$115.23 per head more than the similar steers in 2023.

#### **Carcass Quality Matters:**

The 2022-born calves fed in the AHA National Reference Sire Program at Olsen Ranch in Nebraska proved that Hereford cattle have the ability to grade extremely well while maintaining production efficiency. The 300 steers not only graded 100% Choice and Prime, but they finished with 51.1% grading Prime.
